## **Useful Documents**



We recommend gathering all of the following documents in both paper and digital formats, as they will be needed for various administrative procedures:

Valid Passport or Identity card if you are from the European Economic Area (EEA)
ID photo that conforms to <u>French rules</u>
Acceptance Letter from Cnam-Enjmin
Proof of Address or Accommodation Certificate
Birth Certificate (full copy or extract of birth certificate with parents' details)
Visa or Residence Permit (once you have received it)
Student card or Enrolment certificate (after you have enroled at Cnam-Enjmin)
Bank details (after creating an account with a <u>SEPA-zone</u> bank)

Depending on your country of origin, certain documents must be apostilled or legalised prior to your departure. A sworn (or certified) translation is often required. For more information, please refer to <a href="this link">this link</a>.



Before arriving in France
Receive my Acceptance Letter from Cnam-Enjmin
Send all the necessary documents for my enrolment
Check the validity of my passport
For students from a non-European Union country:
Send my visa application either on the <u>Études en France</u> platform (if my home country applies this procedure) or by contacting with the French Consulate in my host country ( <u>visa information</u> )
Apply for free to join the French Social Security (healthcare) on <u>etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr</u>
For students from a European Union country: Apply for my European health card in my home country
Look for accommodation in Angoulême
Take out Home Insurance
Create my MesServices.etudiant.gouv.fr account (necessary to pay the CVEC fee*, for example)
Estimate my provisional budget
Find a phone plan that suits my needs in France
Join the "le Nil" Discord group
After arriving in France
<u>Validate my Long Stay Visa (VLS-TS)</u> within 3 months of my arrival in France (if applicable)
Take out additional medical insurance if you have not already (medical and civil liability)
Apply for Housing Allowances on the <u>Caf website</u> (if I am eligible)
Take part in Welcome and Beginning-of-the-Year meetings
Open a French bank account to facilitate other administrative processes
Take out a French mobile phone package if necessary
